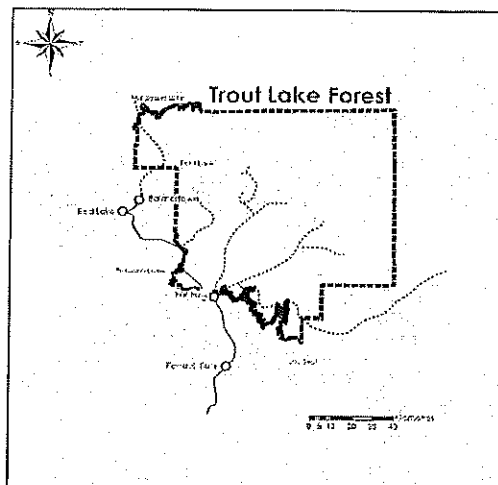
The Ontario **Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF)** and the **Red Lake Local Citizens Committee (LCC)** invite you to review and comment on the 2019-2021 Extension to the 2009-2021 Forest Management Plan (FMP) for the **Trout Lake Forest**.

What is an FMP Extension?

An FMP extension is an extension to the period of the current approved FMP. An FMP may be extended if any planned access, harvest renewal, or maintenance operations in the approved FMP are not expected to be completed by the end of the FMP period.

The purpose of this notice is to:

- Advise you that a FMP extension proposal has been approved by the MNRF, and
- Invite you to review and comment on the planned operations to be implemented during the FMP extension at the locations listed below.

**How to Get Involved**

The planned operations to be implemented during the FMP extension are available with the applicable FMP on the MNRF public website at ontario.ca/forestplans or by appointment, during normal office hours, for a period of 15 days from **September 7 to September 22, 2018** at the MNRF Red Lake District Office (address shown below) and the Domtar Inc. office (address shown below).

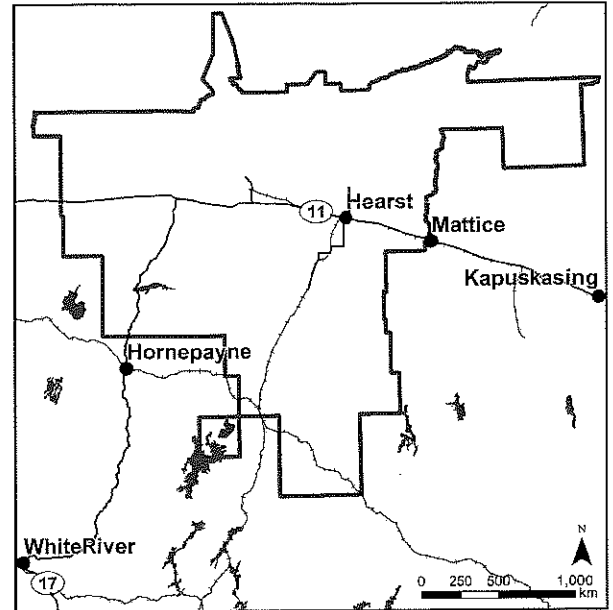

The Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF), Nawiingnokiima Forest Management Corporation (NFMFC) and the Pic Forest Public Consultation Committee (LCC) invite you to participate in the development of the 2019-2029 Forest Management Plan (FMP) for the Pic Forest.

The Planning Process

The FMP takes approximately three years to complete. During this time, five formal opportunities for public consultation and First Nation and Métis community involvement and consultation are provided. The first opportunity (Stage One) for this FMP occurred on June 2, 2017 when the public was invited to "Participate" in the development of the plan. This 'Stage Two' notice is:

 - the proposed long-term management direction for the forest;

- Criteria used for the identification of areas that could reasonably be harvested during the 10-year period of the plan;
- The rationale for the preferred areas for harvest;
- Summary report of the activities of the local citizens' committee to date.

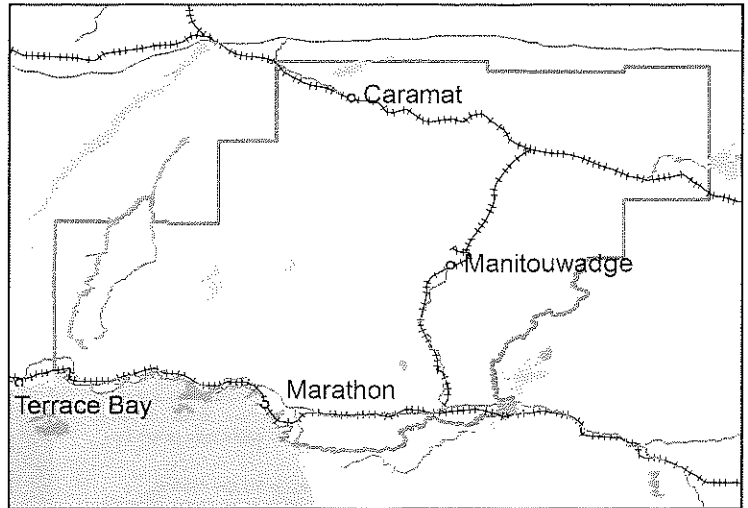

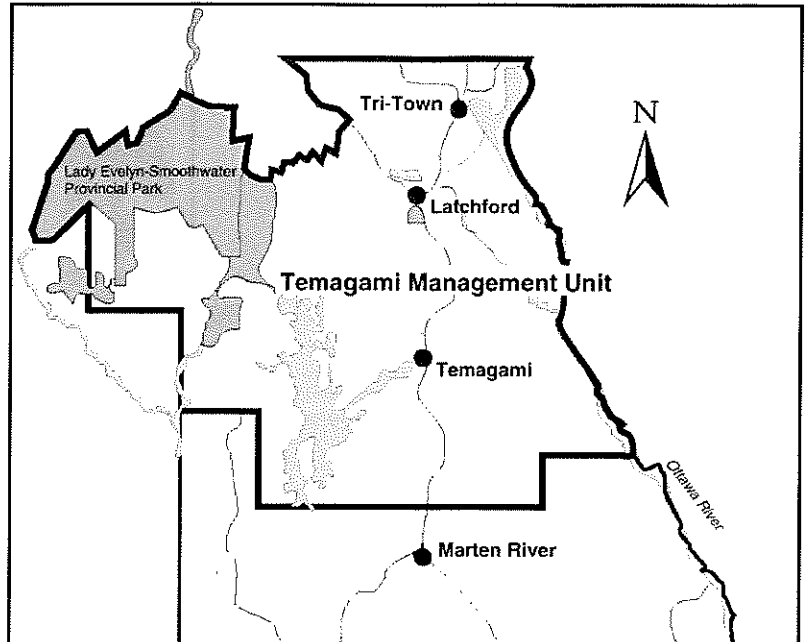

Re: Slash Pile Burning on the Sapawe Forest

This letter is to inform you that Rainy Lake Tribal Resource Management Inc. will be conducting burning of the residual branches and tree tops that remain after logging operations on the Sapawe Forest.

Slash pile reduction programs have been developed to reduce the area covered in slash piles as a result of full tree logging operations, while increasing the area available for regeneration and reducing the fire hazard.

Prescribed burn operations will follow established Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF) guidelines and standards to ensure that all prescribed burns are conducted in a safe and effective manner. The Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources, Rainy Lake Tribal Resource Management Inc. and its Contractors carefully monitor these operations. The safety of everyone is most important.

Burning is scheduled to take place from October 17, 2018 to February 15, 2019 of each year and continues as weather conditions permit.



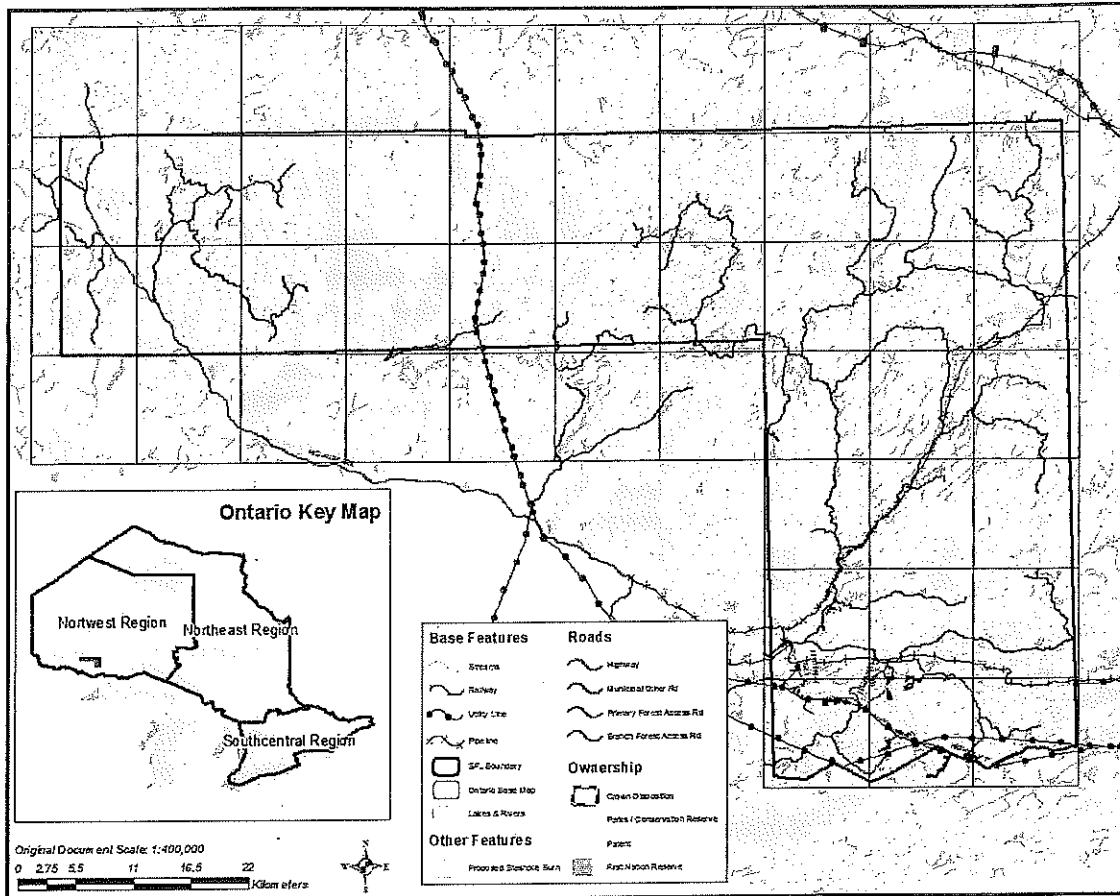

Inspection of MNRF-Approved Prescribed Burn Plan for Slash Pile Burning - Sapawe Forest

The Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF) invites you to inspect the MNRF-approved prescribed burn plan for slash pile burning that will be carried out in the **Sapawe Forest** (see map).



As part of our ongoing efforts to regenerate and protect Ontario's forests, some recently harvested areas have been selected to be burned under the guidelines of the MNRF's *Prescribed Burn Manual*. The prescribed burn will reduce the area covered in slash piles while increasing the area available for regeneration and reducing the fire hazard. The burn is scheduled for ignition between **October 17, 2018** and **February 15, 2019**.

The approved prescribed burn plan for slash pile burning, including specific locations and maps, is available for public inspection by appointment during normal business hours at the office of Rainy Lake Tribal Resource Management Inc. and on the Ontario government website at www.ontario.ca/forestplans until **March 31, 2019**, when the Annual Work Schedule expires.
