**Review of Planned Operations: 2020-2021 Long-term Extension to the Algonquin Park Forest 2010-2020 Forest Management Plan**

The Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNR), Algonquin Forestry Authority, and the Algonquin Park Local Citizens Committee invite you to review and comment on the 2020-2021 Plan Extension to the 2010-2020 Forest Management Plan (FMP) for the Algonquin Park Forest.

A FMP Extension is an extension to the period of the current approved FMP. A FMP may be extended if any planned access, harvest renewal, or maintenance operations in the approved FMP are not expected to be completed by the end of the FMP period.

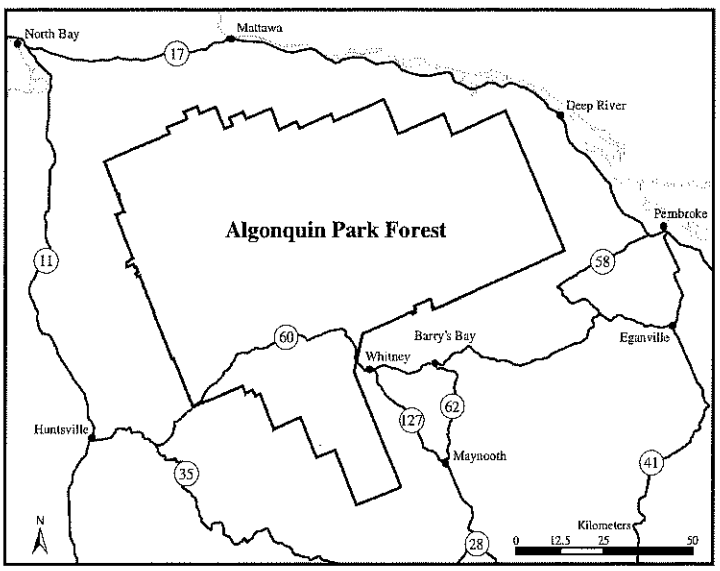
The purpose of this notice is to:

- Advise you that the FMP extension proposal has been approved by the MNR, and
- Invite you to review and comment on the planned operations to be implemented during the FMP extension.

A two-year CP will enable the implementation of forest operations until the 10-year 2021-2031 FMP is approved.

- Request contributions to the background information to be used in planning.

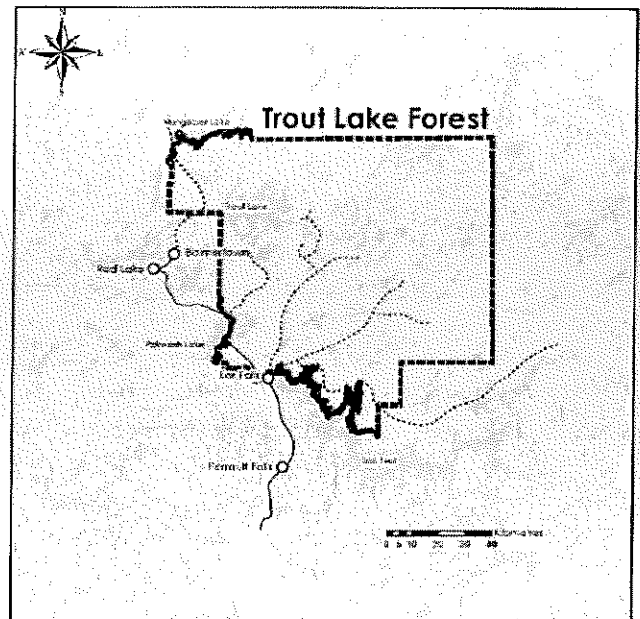
Comments will be considered in revisions to the draft CP.

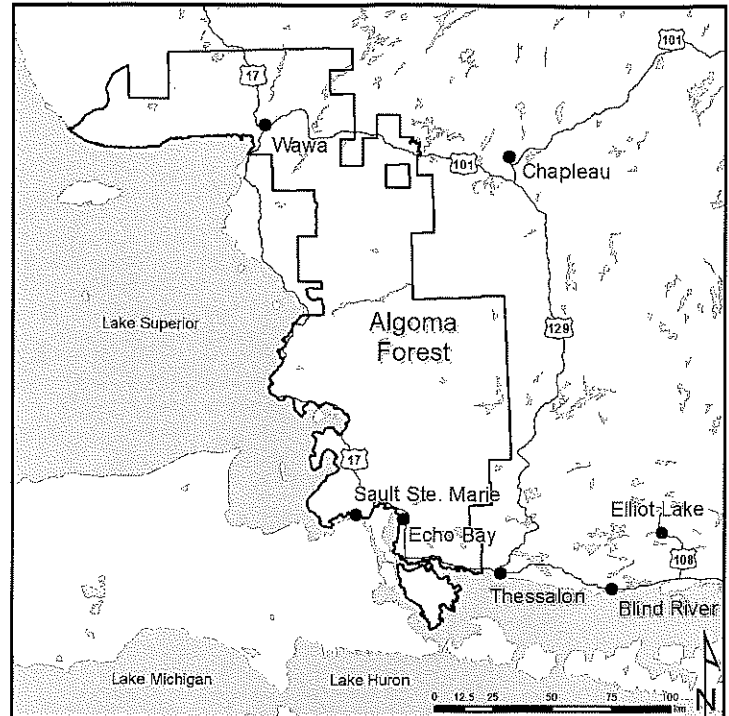
